## NCCC SWR Bylaws:

**DUTIES REGIONAL EXECUTIVE** – The R.E. will call and preside at all regional meetings. On business matters that have been printed in the minutes of the meeting and have laid on the table for one regional meeting, a non-attending club may vote by submitting a written vote to the R.E. Votes must be emailed at least one week before the regional meeting. The R.E. shall cast votes and present motions at any national meeting on behalf of any governor from their region who is not present. The RE shall have written consent which is signed by the governor and is either notarized, or witnessed by another NCCC member of the governor's club for national meetings. In the absence or disability of the R.E., the R.C.D., shall perform the duties of the R.E. In the absence or disability of both the R.E. and the R.C.D., the R.M.D. shall perform the duties of the R.E.

## NCCC National Bylaws:

**DUTIES REGIONAL EXECUTIVE** – The Regional Executive duties shall include: a. Call and preside at a minimum of one meeting per calendar quarter for the purpose of conducting Regional business. b. Cast votes and present motions at any meeting of the National Board of Governors on behalf of any governor from the represented Region who is not present; provided the RE has a NCCC Proxy form, signed by the absent governor with an original or electronic facsimile signatures. The proxy forms shall be presented to the Secretary for validation prior to the opening of the meeting. Upon approval of the Board of Governors, the proxy forms may be forwarded to the Secretary for recording attendance, not to exceed seven days following the meeting, as determined by the date sent
